

BARIATRICS



During the month of November, Fellow Dr. Maya Paige, participated in her *first robotic bariatric procedure*. Robotic bariatric surgery represents a significant advancement in the field of minimally invasive weight-loss procedures, offering enhanced precision, dexterity, and visualization compared to traditional laparoscopic techniques. Using robotic platforms like the da Vinci Surgical System, surgeons can perform complex procedures such as gastric bypass, sleeve gastrectomy, and revisional surgeries with greater accuracy. The system's high-definition 3D visualization and articulated instruments enable finer dissection and suturing.

These features can reduce the risk of complications, minimize blood loss, and improve outcomes, especially in patients with severe obesity or those requiring revisional surgery. For patients, robotic bariatric surgery often translates to shorter hospital stays, less postoperative pain, and faster recovery times. Robotic bariatric surgery is a transformative tool for achieving sustainable weight-loss goals in a safer, more efficient manner. **Dr. Maya Paige looks forward to additional opportunities in robotics.**


